



POWER CONSIGNOR FACT SHEET

Who is Considered a Power Consignor?

- Those super sellers who bring 300 or more items to the event.
 - An item counts as one tag, (one tag can contain multiple items such as a shirt & pants set, or a bundle of Magic Treehouse books).
 - The total # of items is based on what is dropped off at the sale and not necessarily what is reflected in the seller's tagging account.

What's Different about being a Power Consignor?

- Power Consignors can drop their items off early on the first drop-off day with an appointment, (or any time before the published cut-off time during the 2nd day). Check the Consignor Details page under the Drop-Off/Pick-up area to make an appointment.
- Power Consignors who do not mark their items as "Donate" are required to work a 2-hour sorting shift during Breakdown.

How do I sign up for a Sorting Shift?

- Sorting shifts can be found online in the Team Member Schedule.
- Sorting Shifts are 2-hours and do not earn any additional percentage in the consignors check or shop early credits.

How do I earn the extra % on my sold items + fulfill the sorting requirement?

- Sellers can earn a higher percentage by helping for any shift that is worth 4 or more credits in addition to their 2-hour sort shift.
- **BONUS:** Sellers can also fulfill their 2-hour sort shift AND work a 4-hour Team Member shift, AND have their Consignor Fee waived if they sign up for the 6-hour Breakdown shift on the Team Member Schedule. This earns them 70% in their consignor check.

What happens if I have 300+ items not marked donate and I am unable to assist with a sorting shift?

- Per the Consignor Waiver, 5% will be deducted from the consignor commission check if 100% of items are not donated and a 2-hour sorting shift is not completed.
